
Non-Profit Company RADA teams up with the security patrollers of Orange Farm

RADA has teamed up with The Community Police Forum of Orange Farm, situated on the outskirts of Johannesburg. The intent is to assist the police and the 100 volunteers in keeping the Orange Farm community safe and crime free. The Patrollers work daily shifts over a 24-hour period traversing the area on foot or bicycle.

RADA together with sponsor Megaphase Safety have provided these volunteers who work closely with the South African Police Services, with torches, flash vests, socks, gloves and boots. The handing over parade took place on Wednesday the 10th of April, at the local police station in Orange Farm and was attended by RADA CEO, J-P Nobrega and Manager in charge of RADA CARE, Matome Mokgoloboto. Community Police Forum chairperson Andries Machedi and Station Commander Lieutenant Colonel Sbongile Ndaba, Constable Motsapi and Colonel Ndwandwe graciously coordinated the proceedings on the day.

“Our focus is to make sure that the community is safe at all times and that the criminal elements are kept at bay.” says Machedi, who was very grateful for the donated items.

The Orange Farm Patrollers Project is just one of many RADA initiatives. RADA is your place of renewal (an acronym for rape, alcohol, drug and abuse). The registered Non-Profit Organisation was launched in 2014 by founding member J-P Nobrega and strives to empower people to live their best life by giving them the tools necessary to make responsible and wise decisions.

The team adopt a holistic approach to healing, with a pro-active side through their training development centre on the one hand and a reactive side through highly effective healing methods on the other. In March 2018, RADA launched a new and exciting initiative, RADA Inspire – created to encourage ordinary citizens to inspire both themselves and others through a simple change in perspective.

At the heart of it, RADA Inspire is about marrying action with awareness, moving forward inch by inch, and making a difference in people’s lives one day at a time. It is based on the premise that one person can make a difference, and that when you change yourself, you raise your resonance, creating a ripple effect of positive change. In the end, all it takes is to do one small thing differently, empowering others with the belief that they may do the same.

This collaboration with the South African Police Services, The Community Patrollers Forum and RADA forms part of the RADA CARE and Tough Times Projects.
